



Caboolture State High School offers a range of educational pathways in the Senior Secondary School. Students in years 10, 11 and 12 will combine to form the Senior Secondary community at Caboolture SHS.

During years 7 to 9, the school offers a range of subjects that will engage, stimulate, and provide opportunities for students to discover new interests, knowledge and skills. These broad experiences will enable students to gain a better understanding of their interests and strengths in particular subjects, that will align with their pathway choice moving from year 10 into years 11 and 12.

Caboolture State High School's vision for students entering their senior phase of learning is to create opportunities for our students to embark on bright futures. The five elements of our Senior Schooling Framework – student well-being, personalised learning, quality curriculum and pedagogy, quality learning environments and partnerships — underpin the school's ability to deliver a rich, viable and guaranteed senior secondary experience for all students in a safe, engaging and supportive environment.

Our year 10 subject selections are designed to prepare students for what they might experience in year 11 and 12. They are intended to further refine students' interests as well as prepare students for the different learning pathways offered in senior schooling, whether it be an ATAR/university pathway or vocational courses and work.

As students move into year 10, they may like to consider additional opportunities available to them that align with their pathway. University excursions, career expos, school-based traineeships, work experience, certificate courses at school or through external providers can all enhance students' personalised learning plans. While year 10 is a preparatory phase and the first year in the senior phase of learning, it is important for students to recognise that the subject choices they make in year 10 may impact on their subject choices in year 11.

At Caboolture SHS, we provide a balanced education that gives students the opportunity to study across both academic and practical areas. Subjects in year 10 lead into subjects in year 11 and 12, ensuring a seamless pathway for senior students.

In year 10, students will study six subjects each semester – a combination of two core and 4 elective subjects. Students will complete three lessons (70 minutes each) a week for each of their respective timetabled subjects.
