Senior students across Moreton Bay North region are accessing vocational training opportunities through Moreton Bay North Training Alliance (MBNTA), a partnership between six local state schools.

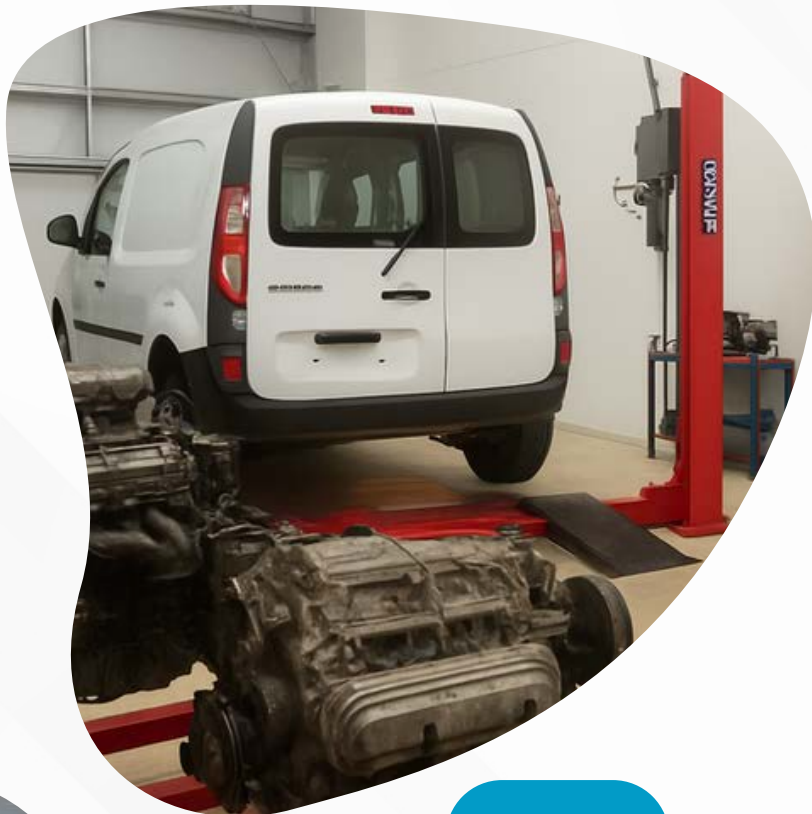

This is part of a dual qualification with Aircraft Line Maintenance. As part of your study you will gain experience to attain your Aeronautical Radio Operator Certification (AROC) & Certification for the CASA recognised RePL (Remote Pilots Licence).

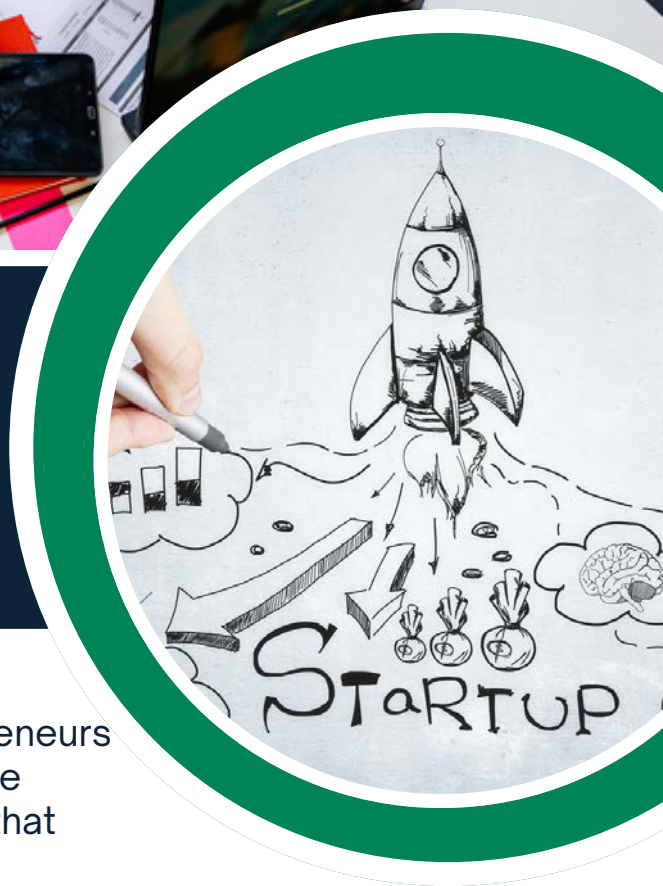

This qualification reflects the job of people who provide support to forest operations in a variety of forestry contexts.

Individuals with this qualification apply specialised skills and knowledge relevant to entry-level roles in forest operations. This includes a basic understanding of the industry and the risks involved in forest operations. They are also expected to conduct basic forest operations.

At this level, workers complete tasks under close supervision involving known routines and procedures but variable work tasks in collaboration with others.

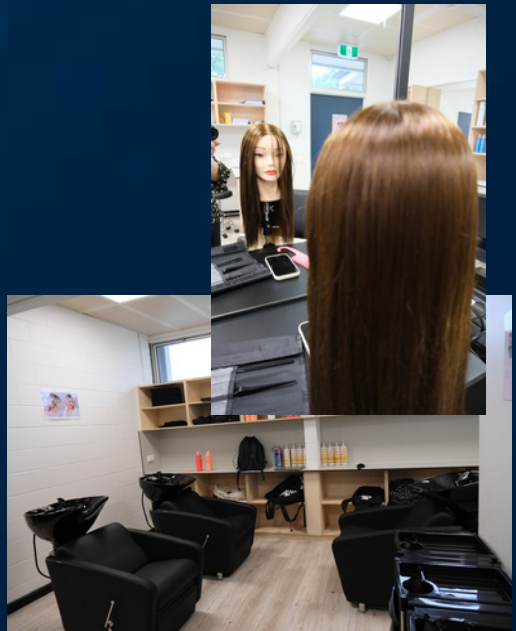


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
