COURSE CONTENT

CUA20215 Certificate II in Creative Industries is delivered, observed and assessed over a two-year (four semesters) period for students in Years 11 & 12. This qualification allows students to develop a range of tasks in the creative industries using practical skills and fundamental operational knowledge while working under direct supervision.

COURSE REQUIREMENTS

The program will be delivered through class-based tasks that will simulate a workplace environment. A range of teaching/learning strategies will be used to deliver the competencies. These include:

- theory worksheets
- practical tasks
- group work
- simulated work activities
- work experience (where possible)

OHS practices will be observed at all times. Specific practices for procedures will be explained prior to the commencement of a new procedure or activity. OHS is an assessed unit of competency. Students are expected to attend school production and performance nights during the year with a view to observing or participating in the tech crew. Participation in these events broadens students' experience, and this directly impacts on skill development.

ASSESSMENTS

Students will be assessed for competency in all units, using the following range of assessment methods:

- Observation with checklists
- Projects / portfolios
- Questioning
- Reports from workplace supervisor

CAREER PATHWAYS

Possible career pathways include: Lighting and sound assistant, staging assistant, events co-ordinator, multimedia designer, multimedia developer, production assistant, graphic designer, media editor, media producer, photographer, publisher, digital designer, entertainment industry, venue attendant, merchandise seller, usher, stagehand, bump-in bump-out loader, stage door assistant, front of house duties, camera person, set designer etc.
