UNIT 1	ASSESSMENT
<p><b>Language that works</b></p> <p>Students commence Year 11 by diving into the question, 'Whose future am I working for?' In this unit, they research, form opinions and create a presentation on the worst job in the world. Later they examine the ways that the tourism industry advertises to their audience.</p>	<p>Multimodal presentation (FA1)</p> <p>Short response to stimulus (FA2)</p>
UNIT 2	ASSESSMENT
<p><b>Texts and Human Experience</b></p> <p>In Unit 2, students explore the hidden agendas of music and film. They start by creating a presentation on the power of a famous protest song. They then examine a biopic film and explain how it represented a true story.</p>	<p>Multimodal Presentation (FA3)</p> <p>Extended response – Blog (FA4)</p>
UNIT 3	ASSESSMENT
<p><b>Language That Influences</b></p> <p>In Unit 3, students explore how language can be used to influence others. They begin by presenting a persuasive speech about a change they would like to see in their local community.</p> <p>Later, students complete an exam set by the QCAA. In this exam, they will explain how two different texts work to influence their audience.</p>	<p>Persuasive Speech (IA1)</p> <p>Short Answer Exam (Common internal assessment)</p>
UNIT 4	ASSESSMENT
<p><b>Representations and Popular Culture Texts</b></p> <p>In the last unit of the course, students examine popular Australian texts. They begin by creating a multimodal presentation that explains the representations in a recent television show.
