Caboolture State High School will receive**

This funding will be used to

- For Reading, increase the National Minimum Standard Achievement for Year 9 students from 90% to 95%. For Year 7 students, 93% to achieve the National Minimum Standard
- For Numeracy, increase the National Minimum Standard Achievement for Numeracy for Year 9 students from 97% to 98%.
- For Year 7 students, 94% to achieve the National Minimum Standard.
- Increase the percentage of students in Year 9 in the upper two bands to:

Reading - 20%

Numeracy - 20%

and have 20% of Year 7 students achieve in the upper two bands.

- For reading, increase the Mean Scale Score Achievement for Reading from 552 to at least 562 in Year 9 and, for Numeracy from 559 to at least 570 in Year 9. In Year 7, achieve a Mean Scale Score of 535 for Reading and 538 for Numeracy.
- Increase the percentage of students attaining a Queensland Certificate of Education (QCE) from 92% in 2014 to 97%.
- 75% of OP eligible students to achieve and OP of 1 to 15.
- Improve our attendance percentage for all students from 85.6% in 2014 to 90%.

Our strategy will be to

- Embed literacy and numeracy skills across the school curriculum.
- Incorporate literacy and numeracy lesson start up drills in all Year 7, 8 and 9 classes.
- Skill all members of staff in mapping the literacy and numeracy ability of students to ensure
- Teachers differentiate curriculum to maximize student learning.
- Develop, through an extensive coaching model, the school ASOT pedagogical to ensure high quality teaching across the school.
- Embed and explicitly teach the key Core Curriculum Elements in the school curriculum.
- Closely track year 12 student data to ensure all students attain their QCE.

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Our school will improve student outcomes by

<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Employ a literacy coach on a half timetable to work with teachers and students to improve the literacy standard of students in Years 7, 8 and 9. • Employ a numeracy coach on a half timetable to work with teachers and students to improve the numeracy standard of students in Years 7, 8 and 9. • Employ a coach on a half timetable to work with teachers and students to increase the number of students in the upper two bands for literacy and numeracy in Years 7 and 9. • Allocate additional time for the Heads of Department to enact the school ASOT agenda in their departments. 	\$ 250 000
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Employ teacher aides to support the learning of students who are identified as requiring support in literacy and/or numeracy. 	\$ 40 000
