UNIT 1	ASSESSMENT
<p>Traditional Times to Today</p> <p>Ngara Wunya Ngulum. Hello and welcome to everyone. Look at the ground, the country you stand on. Do you want to understand more about its traditional culture? Do you want to be part of the rediscovery of the language of our land? Kabi Kabi LOTE is a language revitalisation subject that explores culture, art, language, stories and tradition led by a Kabi Kabi Elder.</p> <p>In 'Traditional Times to Today' students explore the life of the Kabi Kabi people from pre-colonial times until now. Students will learn about Corroborree, cooking and hunting and even paint their very own Bargan (boomerang). They will understand how history has impacted the lives of Kabi Kabi people and be part of the revitalisation of education of culture and language.</p>	Research Project

UNIT 2	ASSESSMENT
<p>Country and its Creatures</p> <p>In 'Country and its Creatures' students will learn that Country is a key concept in Kabi Kabi Culture. They will learn about the importance of a connection to Country. Gawun means to take care of Country and focuses on the importance of looking after the land.</p> <p>Students will learn about Country through its connection to storytelling and artistic expression. They will hear ancient stories passed down by the ancestors in the yarnning circle. They will look at paintings, dances and songs and create their own in response to the stories, events and places they have learnt about.</p> <p>By then end of the semester, students will be able to use Kabi Kabi words to communicate and have a deeper understanding of Indigenous culture and history.</p>	Artistic Presentation
